Main Purpose of Job

To develop and promote the Learning Resource Service of the Trust, this includes our Libraries at Thomas Rotherham College, at Oakwood High School and book services at Sitwell Junior School, Reprographics and DTP services and Information Management Services including Operational GDPR and Records Management. These services will be delivered across the full Trust in line with policies, procedures and legislation under the leadership of and as directed by the Senior Leader.

Working with the Senior Leader and all other appropriate staff to develop the Learning Resource Service Framework and Strategy and implementation plan for the Trust. Lead the delivery of these plans to secure engagement of pupils / students and staff with the services.

Working with the Senior Leader and the established GDPR and Records Management network and all other appropriate staff to contribute to the development of the operational plan to secure effective Records Management and GDPR compliance across the Trust. Secure the Freedom of Information Policy and Publication Scheme for the Trust.

There is a connectivity between this post and a number of other key management posts. All staff are required to work together proactively to ensure smooth and efficient services to pupils / students, staff and others.

Excellent standards of behaviour, respect and learning depend upon the ‘tone’ set by all members of the Trust community. We build upon our strengths – together!

For the purposes of this Job Description and Person Specification, Trust is Inspire Trust and all Academies working within the Trust. All duties outline below are the responsibility of the post holder who will be accountable for delivery. Where there is specific connectivity with
